PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE:

Bíll Need

Well, I guess everyone has noticed the dips in the temperature of the last week or two and if you've attempted to go east on Avon Road, the weekend traffic jams at the cider mill, all signs that summer is gone, and it's time to admire those beautiful autumn colors and enjoy the good sleeping weather.

Like many other residents of Rochester, Stony Ridge will be celebrating the 200th anniversary of the settling of our town and the 50th anniversary of becoming a chartered municipality. The city and DDA made available (free of charge) about 18,000 daffodil bulbs for residents throughout the city to commemorate the occasion. The Board was able to secure 100 of these free bulbs that will be planted at the large Gazebo flower bed and others have been donated for planting around our sign at the corner of Parkdale and Letica road and in the planting beds on either side of the entrance road leading to the circle. This should provide a warm splash of bright yellow after those gray days of winter. We (the Board members) would hope that as many of our co-owners as possible would consider planting a few daffodils in front of their homes to heighten the impact and join in the celebration. They are available at Home Depot, Lowes and other garden supply stores. Fall is the time to plant them.

This summer the Board has spent a lot of time considering at least two major changes to our current bilaws. The first proposed change concerns allowing the installation of garage doors with a band of plain windows in the top panel of a new garage door. This would eliminate the "coalmine" effect that all of us get whenever we walk into the garage from the house and start feeling around for the door opener button, and we might even save a little bit on our electric bill. There had been a suggestion that on existing garage doors that the current top panel be used to replace the existing bottom panel that over the years of use has been dinged up and may even be showing signs of rust and then purchase a new window panel for the top section. In talking to several garage door providers they all said the joint connection at the panel junction has changed considerably over the years, and most likely the labor cost in making such a switch would more than offset the anticipated savings. With this in mind this option will not be made available, a new door will have to be purchased, which includes a glass panel.

The second proposed change would allow for the installation of a retractable awning over each coowners deck (should you desire an awning). This has been a common suggestion from many co-owners looking to increase their usage of their decks during the spring, summer, and fall. We have met with two companies that sell and install awnings and we are working on developing the necessary regulations to insure conformity throughout our community.

It is our objective to make these regulations changes and available to our residents well before the beginning of the spring construction season.

I am looking forward to seeing all of you at this year's Christmas Party brunch. Cherry Creek is a great venue for this event and our Social Committee always seems to outdo themselves every year.

Some Remínders.....

Trash containers should not be put out before 6 pm on the day before pick up. If you're putting trash in bags and not containers, please use black trash bags so the crows don't have a feast on your garbage. For some reason they ignore the black bags and are attracted to the white ones. If it is windy or supposed to be windy, please be sure your recyclables are anchored down so the loose papers, milk cartons etc. don't fly all over the neighbors' yards and down the street.

If you have a 4 legged furry friend that you take for a walk, please clean up their droppings so other folks don't find them by "accident". This includes the back areas as well as the front of the condos. Remind your guests that there is no street parking on the ends of the Circle. We need to be sure that emergency vehicles can get through if they need to.

Speaking of vehicles! Everyone needs to be aware of the speed limit on the Circle. Be especially careful backing out of the driveway and check for cars speeding along. If a family member is known to have a "lead foot" ask them to slow down and obey the speed limit signs. The speed limit is 15.

You must obtain a modification form from AMI for anything you are doing on the outside of your unit and get it approved <u>before</u> you begin the project. This includes, decks, brick pavers, generators, etc. Those items are yours to maintain and will be recorded on your deed so that future owners will be aware that they need to maintain them. Those forms are also available on our web site: <u>www.stonyridgecondos.net</u>. We always recommend that the contractor send a copy of his insurance and license along with the form.

ATTENTION SNOW BIRDS!!

If you are heading south this winter there are a few things to remember:

Be sure a neighbor or someone has a key to your home in case there might be an emergency and access is needed. It's also a good idea to have a neighbor, friend or family member stop in every week or so to check the unit out. Water should be turned off to washers and ice makers to avoid water leaks and damage. Furnaces should be checked as well to be sure heat is on to at least 55 to prevent anything freezing. In case of a power outage, some alarm systems may be triggered and require resetting. Our bylaws say that an owner should let someone in the complex know if they will be gone for an extended period of time.
