- Painting buildings on Lantern, Paddle Wheel, and Autumn Lane.
- Shrub rejuvenation. About 50% complete; work will resume in late Fall.
- Replacement of three to four roofs and privacy walls.
- The Clubhouse Deck, Roof, and Drainage System have been replaced.

Tennis & Pickleball Courts




On Tuesdays, after 5 pm, you can usually find a casual gathering of players. You are welcome to join them for a couple of hours of recreational pickleball.

Annual Meeting of King's Cove Co-owners, June 26, 2025

President Frank Moss called the meeting to order at 6 PM followed by management comments, and a report by officers. This included a lengthy report on the plan to launch a new Information Guide for Residents to help with communications. Mike Jahn gave an update on the erosion project.

During the Q&A session three major issues were raised:

- 1. Feral cats, and the need for co-owners to not provide food and shelter.
- 2. Clubhouse access, and the desire for co-owners to have more access.
- 3. Pool hours, and a request for the pool to be open longer.

At a special and brief meeting of the Board following the Annual Meeting, the Board elected the officers listed on page 1 of the newsletter, and:

- Discussed pool opening hours and decided to extend the pool hours to 10 PM on a trial basis. Earlier opening hours were deemed unfeasible as the period 8-10 AM is when the pool and pool area are being cleaned. In particular, the pool must be vacant while serviced.
- The matter of Clubhouse access was deemed more complex and will be taken up at upcoming Board meetings.

A Trail at Our Doorstep

Paint Creek Trail Overview

Adjacent to King's Cove, the Paint Creek Trail is an 8.9-mile recreational path traversing the communities of Rochester, Rochester Hills, Oakland Township, Orion Township, and the Village of Lake Orion. Originally constructed on a former railroad corridor, the trail closely follows the scenic

Paint Creek—a designated trout stream—offering excellent fishing opportunities at various points along the route.

The Trail width varies from 50 to 150 feet, well beyond the 8-12-foot gravel strip used by walkers and cyclists.

Trail Management

The Paint Creek Trail is owned and managed by the Paint Creek Trailways Commission, which includes representatives from each connected community. The Commission is dedicated to maintaining the Trail's natural beauty and ensuring it remains well-kept. Local municipalities provide routine maintenance and removal of fallen trees.

Trail Benefits

The Paint Creek Trail is renowned for its natural beauty and is an ideal place for walking, which offers significant health benefits. The trail also serves as a social hub, providing opportunities to meet neighbors and enjoy a peaceful escape from daily life. Benches are placed along the trail for rest, and there is a waiting list for those interested in donating new benches. Note: Unauthorized modifications—such as adding decorations, personal access trails, or furniture—are not permitted.



Nature enthusiasts will appreciate the abundant wildlife-deer are commonly seen at dusk-and the ever-changing display of wildflowers throughout the year.

Friends of the Paint Creek Trail

The Friends of the Paint Creek Trail is a volunteer group dedicated to supporting the Trailways Commission and improving the trail environment. They played a key role in establishing the Moutrie Pollinator Garden, along the Trail, adjacent to

King's Cove, which supports butterflies and other pollinators.

The Friends group is open to all who wish to participate and typically meets four times a year at the Paint Creek Cider Mill in Goodison. The current president is Kings Cove resident Louis Carrio. For membership information, visit paintcreektrailfriends.org.

Trail Use and Etiquette

The trail is popular with both walkers and cyclists. Cyclists are reminded to be considerate of others, especially children, and to observe the 15-mph speed limit. Trail etiquette suggests alerting others before passing, either with a bell or a verbal cue such as "passing on your left.
